CHILD PROTECTION & RIGHTS

Child Rights & Protection Awareness

15 public & private schools sensitised on child rights, protection, and safeguarding across Alimosho LGA. 5,000+ children equipped with knowledge of their rights, personal safety, and how to report abuse.

✔ **Key Outcome: Children demonstrated increased confidence in reporting abuse**

Protect Child Domestic Workers (PCDW)

Flagship programme funded by the Freedom Fund & U.S. Dept of State. School sensitisations, community engagements, advocacy roundtables, CDW Champions Forums, and parent & teacher sessions

✔ **Key Outcome: Communities took collective responsibility for CDW protection**

Child Rights Champions Forums

5 Forums established in selected schools. Building on our existing Child Rights Ambassadors programme at Alimosho Grammar School (50+ ambassadors), Havanah College and Millennium School, Egbeda.

✔ **Key Outcome: Pupils became peer advocates in schools & communities**

Community Mobilisation

Deepened engagement with CDAs, landlord associations, traditional leaders, and faith institutions including Ijegemo Palace, ALATE CDA, Egan Landlord Association, and multiple churches.

✔ **Key Outcome: Community leaders committed to identifying vulnerable children**

International Women's Day (Safe Space)

Celebrated IWD and honoured 45 remarkable women. Safe space for rights empowerment. Women left knowing their rights and the support available to them.

✔ **Key Outcome: 200 women reached with rights, SRHR & empowerment information**

Metro 97.7 FM (Women's Day Radio)

Took women's rights to the airwaves. Community sensitisation discussions on available support services, reaching women across Lagos.

✔ **Key Outcome: 50 women engaged through radio broadcast**

International Day of the Girl Child

Targeted programming equipping girls with education on their rights, person knowing she has the right to be safe, educated, and heard.

✔ **Key Outcome: 60 girls reached on rights, personal safety & empowerment**

Sexual Violence Prevention Sensitisation

In collaboration with key stakeholders, conducted sessions in 4 schools: Dad College Ijegan (60).

✔ **Key Outcome: 290 students equipped to recognize, prevent & report sexual violence**

2026 PRIORITIES

- Expand Child Rights Champions Forums to primary schools through SPARK.
- Strengthen survivor support and trauma-informed care pathways.
- Deepen gender justice work, more safe spaces, more women reached on SRHR & domestic violence.
- Scale advocacy against exploitative child domestic work nationally.
- Increase community safeguarding structures across target LGAs.
- Enhance referral pathways and access to social protection programmes
